N. B. When a Soldier has lost an Eye or Limb, or has been wounded or disabled to the Service; the Discharge must particularly express the Case from whence proceeding, as when, where, and how it took place. Should any Merit rewards be consequent, the same is to be inserted in the Man's Description; the Surgeon, or Assistant Surgeon in his absence, will sign his Name in the Margin, opposite the Case arranged for the Discharge being granted, which will be considered as his Certificate of the Man being unfit for further Service, and he will also countersign the Commanding Officer's Certificate above. The Period of Service in the Body of the Discharge, is to be filled up in Words as implying and not in Figures. Service prior to the Age of Eighteen, is not to be denoted by the Number.
